PURPOSE OF REPORT:

Consideration of a recommendation to vary the CEO's financial delegations to enable the payment of progress claims made in respect of the Early Childhood Development Centre construction.

BACKGROUND:

The Shire of Moora has commenced the construction of the Early Childhood Development Centre. With the commencement of construction, the Shire is now receiving progress claims as set out in the works contract. The claims are being made in accordance with defined project milestones. Claims are processed in accordance with the Shire's financial policies and procedures. While the current financial delegations are suitable for general procurement purposes, they are inflexible in respect of the payments for major project purposes. This is because progress claims by contractors commonly exceed the prevailing limits embodied in of the CEO's delegation.

COMMENT:

The current delegations do not facilitate efficient and timely payment of progress claims because Council is currently required to approve the payment of sums exceeding the CEO's delegation. This, in conjunction with the multi-stage verification of progress claims has the potential to delay payments beyond the contractual terms. As the coordination of Council meetings and payment runs is not a natural fit, the current circumstances give rise to potential penalties for delayed payments.

The administrative options available to resolve this issue present a range of complications relating to transparency, compliance and the integrity of financial reporting payments.

To remedy the current issue, it is recommended that the CEO be authorised to approve the payment of Fleetwood Australia progress claims in respect of the Early Childhood Development Centre project at their face value, as and when received. The CEO will provide a report to Council of payments that fall outside the approved delegations until the conclusion of the project.

11.1 CARNABY COCKATOO STRUCTURE – PRELIMINARY SURVEY RESULTS

CEO advised that the preliminary results of the recent phone survey undertaken relating to the proposed Carnaby Cockatoo Structure had been received and indicated a mixed community response. A further report will be provided to Council on the 18th of October.

The Shire is yet to receive a firm proposal from the Kerkhoff Carnaby Group. The Shire is not in a position to take any further steps until a proposal is received. Council noted the need to engage Main Roads WA in respect of road works assessments and the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation in respect of water licences and sewerage services in Apex Park.

Background

Each year, the Shire of Moora awards up to \$60,000 in funding to assist community groups to undertake their projects, facility upkeep or events. The programme is part of the Shire's annual budget cycle and aims to facilitate, by way of relatively small funding contributions, projects, facility upkeep and or events that may not ordinarily be possible.

The community budget funding programme has become increasingly popular and aims to strike a funding balance that recognises the efforts of the various community groups and their capacity to independently raise funding to support their community objectives and endeavours.

Applications and Guidelines

The community budget funding programme is supported by a framework of guidelines designed to assist applicants apply for funding. The programme embodies a competitive element that applies to all applications. Despite the availability of clear guidelines and Shire staff to assist in the formulation of applications, adherence to the guidelines has not been a high priority for many applicants. The Shire has formerly been tolerant to this loose compliance as the number of applications and their expectations has allowed some latitude, as the number of applications did not place the fund under pressure and organisations attempted to respond within the limitations imposed by COVID-19.

The fading impact of COVID-19 and growing popularity of the programme has now placed the programme under considerable pressure. Application for tens of thousands of dollars have exceeded the intent of the scheme, tested the guidelines, and changed expectations as to entitlements.

Assessment and Recommendation of Applications

All applications were assessed against the CBS's published guidelines and criteria, and regard was had to the principles that motivated and underpinned the original establishment of the programme.

The assessment considered the possible growth of expectations the programme might become a fixed or semi-permanent component of the financial mix on which community groups could rely. This expectation is not to be fostered.

Applications were ranked according to the funding programme's originating principles, its objectives and submissions that created the broadest community benefit. Service organisations having the greatest reliance on funding for open community benefit were ranked more highly, while clubs and groups having other funding options and closed memberships were ranked less highly.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Funding for the Community Budget Submissions is provided for as a component of the annual budget process; the funding provision for 2023-2024 has been increased from \$60,000 to \$80,000 for this round only.
