The Shire of Moora's Mission is "to provide the leadership, services and infrastructure that will meet with needs of the community and surrounds.

This financial year we are investing in major transformational long-term projects that will create community longevity and capability.

Operational activities - 2021 and beyond

- Grandstand demolition and public swimming pool refurbishment
- Ongoing road maintenance and rebuilding Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Routes / new CBH receival points
- Sport and recreation support and refurbishment of facilities netball courts, tennis courts, oval

These ongoing projects will make our towns and region more liveable, resilient, capable and sustainable.

NEW initiatives 2021 and beyond...

- Early Childhood Development and Learning Centre
- Hydrotherapy pool
- Housing Strategy
- Aerodrome Development
- Drought Proofing

These projects -

- will expand the existing capability and amenity of key community assets
- involve multi-year plans and expenditure
- will be completed over the next I- 4 years and create additional local jobs

Delivering infrastructure supporting the community and providing new residents and enterprises with certainty about establishing themselves in the community.

Key Project – Early Childhood Development Centre

- Offering 55 Childcare places increased from 28
- Providing early regional childhood development and health services, and wrap-around support for children from birth to 6 years
- Increased local support for families and reduced need to travel to Perth for certain services
- Increased linkages with specialist early childhood practitioners and institutions
- Creation of new local skills and jobs, making a more attractive town in which to live and work
- Funded by Council, State Treasury loans and government grants

Providing unparalleled access to child health services and early learning for the community of the Shire of Moora and beyond through innovative services and skills

Key project - Addressing Housing Shortage

- Through a local planning strategy, ensure the development of flexible housing options for new workers and families
- Working with local businesses to ensure the availability of appropriate housing, further attracting new business and their staff to our region
- Purchasing land for development from the State Government
- Constructing suitable and accessible new housing
- Funded by Council, State Treasury loans and Government grants

The development of new housing enables attraction and retention of new workers and families to our town — building sustainability into our local economy.

- Enhance accessibility for people living with a disability

Enhancing the wellbeing and fitness of Moora's community through flexible and comprehensive

Key Project - Moora Aerodrome

- Increase the commercial attractiveness of the aerodrome and its facilities to aviation operators
- Increased access for firefighting and emergency services
- Sealing sections of runway and taxi ways
- · Installation of water tanks and pumps to support aerial firefighting
- Increase the safety of operations
- Construction of helipad
- Funded by Council, State Treasury loans and Government grants

Improvement of the Moora Aerodrome to provide better access for emergency firefighting and medical services, enabling the expansion of commercial operators and attracting recreational pilots to our area.

Drought Proofing

- Construct new weir for water collection and storage
- Interlink existing stormwater network to feed new weir
- Create new public green space using weir as centre-piece
- Develop and install new efficient water systems for public spaces
- Establish a new caravan park close to new proposed weir
- Funded by Council, State Treasury loans and Government grants

Leverage Shire of Moora's strategic position as a regional HUB, enhancing and increasing water collection and storage to ensure sustainable community and enterprise growth.

- Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Route
- CBH receival point
- Local distributor roads

- Funded by Council, business partners and Government grants
