(b) give a copy of that report to the Minister within 3 months after the audit report is received by the local government.

Within 14 days after a local government gives a report to the Minister under subsection 4(b), the CEO must publish a copy of the report on the local government's official website.

The Shire's 2024 Audit Completion Report dated 18 December 2024 contains significant matters requiring the CEO to undertake the actions required by Section 7.12 of the Act.
