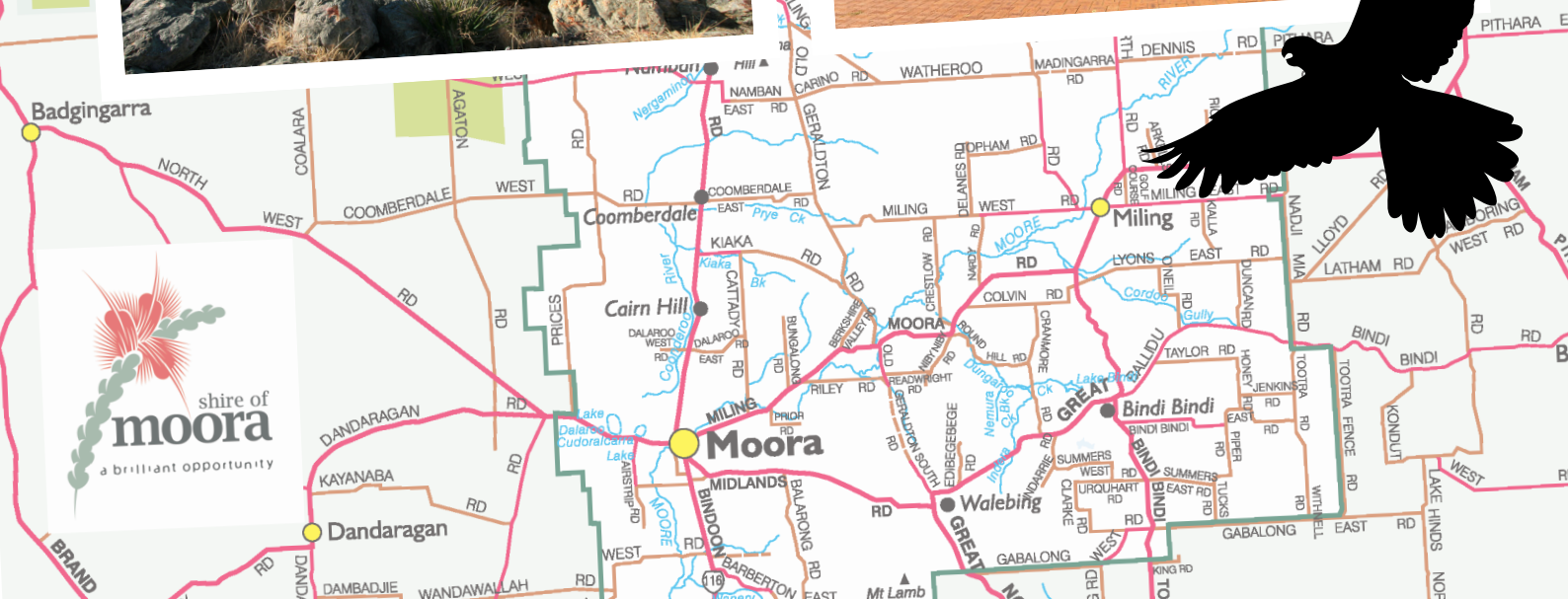


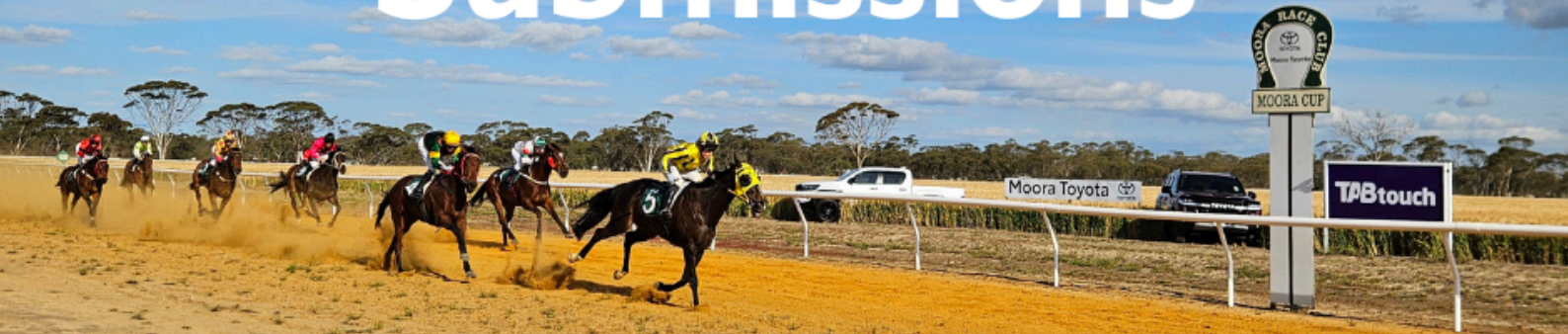

2025 - 2026 Community Budget Submissions



The Shire of Moora is proud to announce the recipients of the 2025–26 Community Budget Submissions, with a total of \$101,423.50 in approved support. This includes \$69,613.50 in cash funding and \$31,810.00 in in-kind contributions, highlighting the Shire's commitment to empowering local groups, events and initiatives. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who took the time to apply. We received nearly \$175,000 in requests, and we are delighted to have been able to support every applicant in some way.

The **Central Midlands Agricultural Society** received \$10,195.00 in support for the Moora Show. This included venue hire waivers, equipment hire such as a forklift, generator, and green bins, as well as contributions toward entertainment needs.

The **Central Midlands Senior High School** was awarded \$2,500.00 to cover facility hire fee waivers and provide two \$250 scholarships to assist students and school programs.

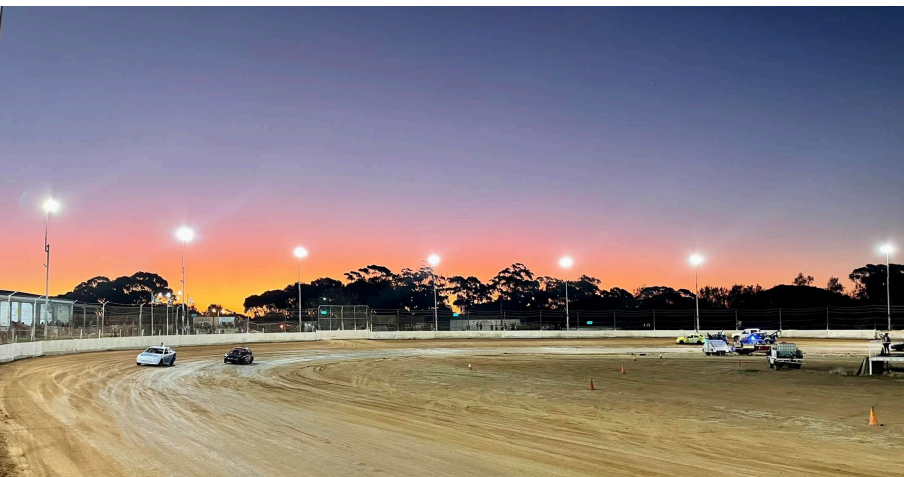
The **Central Midlands Senior High School P&C** received \$2,292.00 in support for the School Ball and community events, including hire fee waivers and family pool passes.

The **Central Midlands Speedway Association** was allocated \$9,576.00 to purchase new pit lighting, enhancing both safety and operations at the speedway.



The **Miling Community Christmas Tree** celebration was supported with \$176.00, covering hire fee waivers for the annual community event.

The **Miling Primary School** received \$1,567.00 in fee waivers for facility use, swimming carnival costs, swimming lessons, and an end-of-year book award.



The **Moora Bed Race & Street Festival Organising Committee** secured \$14,130.00 in funding to provide rides, entertainment, and traffic control, helping to bring this vibrant festival to life.



The **Moora Lake View Golf Club** was awarded \$10,681.00 for the purchase of 100 chairs, a chemical toilet, and patio materials.

The **Moora Lions Club** received \$5,860.00 to cover the Twilight Markets hire fee waiver, as well as the purchase of gazebos and raffle vouchers to support community fundraising efforts.

The **Moora Playgroup** was granted \$800.00 in fee waivers to enable the group's ongoing use of the Moora Bowls Club throughout the year.

The **Moora Primary School** obtained \$2,050.00 to cover facility hire fee waivers and provide an end-of-year book award.

The **Moora Primary School P&C** received \$1,170.00, covering oval hire fee waivers along with gym and pool passes to support school activities.



The **Moora Race Club** was supported with \$10,796.50 as a contribution toward concreting the stables floor, improving facilities for race events.

The **Moora Triathlon Committee** received \$4,094.00 for sundry expenses and insurance, along with in-kind support covering pool hire, road closures, and signage for the 2026 event.



The **Moora YouthCARE Council** was allocated \$3,000.00 in combined support, including \$1,000 of in-kind venue use for a Totally Local Concert and \$2,000 for school chaplaincy support.

The **NAIDOC Committee** secured \$2,410.00 to cover fee waivers and NAIDOC merchandise, supporting the community's annual NAIDOC event.



The **Rotary Club of Moora** was awarded \$2,400.00 in support for the Australia Day breakfast and the provision of vouchers for the Moora Rotary Auction Night.

Rural Health West, on behalf of Curtin Medical School, received \$1,956.00 in in-kind support for the 2026 Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program, including venue hire, bus hire, and advertising.

St Joseph's Primary School was granted \$2,240.00 for bus hire supporting excursions, swimming and winter carnivals, a P&F Quiz Night, and end-of-year awards.



The **Stay on Your Feet** program received \$1,430.00 to purchase exercise equipment, polo shirts, a coffee machine, and catering for their 20-year celebration.

The **Watheroo Development Association** obtained \$2,184.00 in hire fee waivers to support the Golf WA RV Tour and the Watheroo Christmas Tree event.

The **Yued Aboriginal Corporation** was supported with \$6,016.00 to assist with monthly meetings, Coolangah Park Busy Bees, and branded merchandise or arts fair activities.

Finally, the **Moora Darts Club** received \$3,900.00 to purchase a sign, dart boards, lighting, and an honour board, enhancing the club's facilities.

The Shire of Moora's Community Budget Submissions program continues to strengthen local groups, enhance community events and support projects that enrich the lives of residents. The combined investment of over \$101,000 demonstrates the Shire's ongoing commitment to a vibrant, inclusive and well-supported community.

NAIDOC CELEBRATION BRINGS THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER

On Saturday 13th September, our community came together for a vibrant and inspiring 2025 NAIDOC Celebration, honouring the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The day reflected this year's theme, "The Next Generation: Strength, Vision & Legacy," with a wonderful showcase of culture and community spirit.

The celebration began with a heartfelt Welcome to Country by Skye Galbraith, setting a tone of respect and unity for the day's events. Special acknowledgements were given to the dedicated Moora NAIDOC Committee – Addellamay Ryder, Dolores Yappo, Diane Mippy, Chloey Narrier, Trida Taylor, and Madeline Anderson – along with the Shire of Moora for their support in making the event possible.

A highlight of the morning was the powerful didgeridoo performance by Dakota Baker, followed by a breathtaking display from the Traditional Dancers: Cassias Narrier, Declan Yappo, Ashley Dann JNR, Kailis Kyle, Lane Mippy, Clinton Stack, Ronald Stack, Emmilis Mippy, Mya Yappo, Aniyah Yates, Jalirah Warrell, and Lazarn Narrier. Their performances celebrated culture and story, leaving a lasting impression on all who attended.

The celebration featured a wide range of activities and entertainment for all ages. Local schools – Moora Primary School, St Joseph's Primary School and Central Midlands Senior High School – joined in with artwork displays. Families enjoyed the fun provided by Perth Bouncy Castles, Chittering Gingin Lions Club Train, Jurien Petting Farm, WA Football and Jarred Patmore, while local Aboriginal musicians Mike, Veeda and Tequila Edwards, and Cameron Wilkes filled the day with music.

Children and adults alike were drawn to the Story Telling Corner with Patrina Dawson, and visitors explored the information stalls from Yued AC, Yorna Yarning, DBCA, Moore Catchment Council, Beemurra, and the NAIDOC Committee Merch Stall.

The celebration would not have been complete without the delicious meal prepared by Harvest Road and Beemurra, which included kangaroo stew and damper, kangaroo kebabs, beef burgers, hotdogs and a selection of drinks.

At the start of the month, the CEO of Yued Aboriginal Corporation, Rewi Lyall, visited Moora with a group of guests and was treated to a vibrant display of our local Yued boys' traditional dance.

The boys were accompanied by the deep, resonant sounds of the didgeridoo, masterfully played by Dakota Baker, a Wadjudk Noongar man. Dakota's powerful performance set the perfect tone for a morning of cultural sharing and storytelling. During their performance, the boys shared stories through dance including the lively emu dance and the captivating Honey Bee story. Their bodies were painted with traditional ochre designs, with dots representing baby emus and lines symbolising the larger emus.

This talented group of dancers has been performing together for four years, proudly keeping their culture and traditions alive. Their dedication and joy shone through every step of the performance, leaving a lasting impression on all who attended.

A big thank you to Dakota Baker for his powerful didgeridoo performance and to the talented Traditional Dancers: Cassias Narrier, Declan Yappo, Ashley Dann JNR, Kailis Kyle and Lane Mippy. Their performance was not only entertaining but also a meaningful reminder of the rich cultural heritage of the Yued people, ensuring these traditions continue to be celebrated for generations to come.

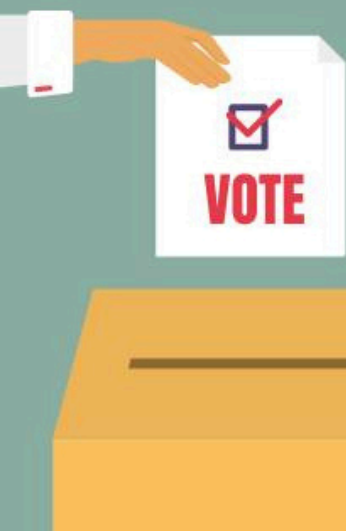
MOORA MUSIC PROJECT
