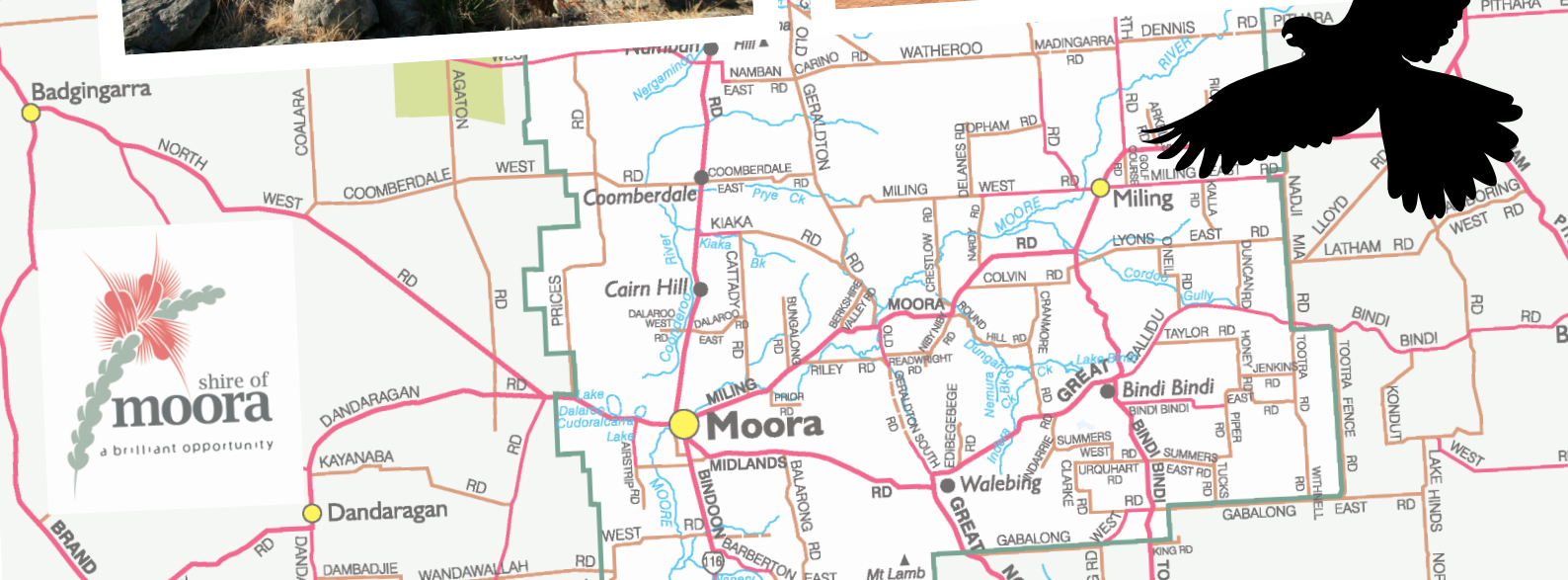

MOORA ANNOUNCED AS STATE FINALIST IN THE 2025 TIDY TOWNS AWARDS

The Shire of Moora is delighted to announce that our town has been named a State Finalist in the 2025 Keep Australia Beautiful WA Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Awards!

This prestigious recognition celebrates Moora's outstanding commitment to environmental sustainability, community wellbeing, and local pride. It acknowledges the incredible collaboration between our residents, community groups, and organisations who make Moora such a vibrant, caring, and sustainable place to live.

This year, Moora entered 25 innovative projects across multiple award categories — from waste reduction and environmental education to heritage preservation and community action. These projects represent the collective efforts of local groups such as the Moore Catchment Council, Yued Aboriginal Corporation, Moora Men's Shed, St Joseph's School, Recycle Moore and many others who work tirelessly to protect and enhance our environment.

Among the standout initiatives are the Carnaby Cockatoo Conservation & Big Carnaby Sculpture Project, the Moore Catchment Council's extensive revegetation program, and the work of Recycle Moore and St Josephs Primary School.

Moora now stands proudly alongside Kalgoorlie, Port and South Hedland, Sandstone, and Williams as one of five towns recognised as state finalists — an extraordinary achievement for our small regional community. The winners will be announced at a gala lunch on Friday, 28 November 2025, at Optus Stadium. We're keeping our fingers crossed and celebrating this fantastic milestone for Moora and everyone involved.

This achievement is not only a recognition of the projects delivered but also a celebration of the people — our volunteers, schools, and community leaders — whose passion, creativity, and teamwork make Moora shine.



MOORE CATCHMENT COUNCIL STATE FINALIST IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY CATEGORY

The Moore Catchment Council (MCC) has been named a State Finalist in the Environmental Sustainability Category of the 2025 Keep Australia Beautiful WA Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Awards. The recognition places MCC alongside Albany, Darkan, Kalgoorlie, Margaret River, and Port and South Hedland.

Led by Rachel Walmsley and Helen Watkins, MCC has coordinated a range of projects that showcase innovation, community collaboration, and a strong commitment to caring for the land. One of the flagship efforts is the Carnaby Cockatoo Conservation where MCC continues to monitor nesting boxes, collect data, and involve young residents in hands-on conservation.

Another standout project involved the recovery of a fallen Salmon Gum at Warwick Park farm. Working with Yued Elder Fred Mogridge, MCC collected six wool bales of seed for regeneration and salvaged hollows for cockatoo nesting boxes. This creative response to natural loss transformed an unfortunate event into a positive example of community resilience and biodiversity restoration. Complementing this was MCC's large-scale revegetation program, which saw 90,000 seedlings planted across 90 hectares of land. Partnering with farmers, volunteers, and Yued cultural supervisors, the initiative is restoring native ecosystems, stabilising soils, and improving habitat for threatened wildlife.



MCC's focus on environmental education has been equally strong. At the Moora Show, their Landcare Education Display and Native Plant Giveaway helped residents learn about revegetation, weed control, and soil health, while encouraging hands-on action through the distribution of native seedlings. The Council also hosted an engaging Owl Workshop and Sundowner in collaboration with the Moora Men's Shed, WA Birds of Prey Centre, and Simon Cherriman's Re-Cyc-Ology Project. The event featured live owl encounters, nest box building, and community discussions about reducing the use of harmful rodenticides.

Rounding out their efforts, MCC led a Community Bus Tour of Revegetation Projects, giving locals a first-hand look at successful landcare initiatives and inspiring more people to "just start somewhere and make a difference." The tour highlighted the tangible results of long-term community cooperation, blending environmental education with local pride.

Beyond their own projects, MCC has supported numerous community efforts across Moora, including the Gardiner Street Arts Collective's Community Garden, and several Moora Men's Shed sustainability projects. Wish them luck!

On Monday 27 October, the Moora Recreation Centre came alive with the delicious smells and happy chatter of our community cooking classes — nom! and nom! Youth — proudly delivered by Foodbank WA and made FREE thanks to the generous support of Arc Infrastructure.

Both sessions focused on healthy eating and building practical skills for everyday life. There were six participants in the adults’ session and six young people from Moora Primary School and Central Midlands Senior High School in the youth session. Across the classes, participants explored the five core food groups, and the adults also learned how to read food labels to make healthier choices at the supermarket.

Everyone rolled up their sleeves to cook a range of tasty, healthy dishes including Guac On, Nacho Stacks, Chicken Pad Thai, and Choc Amazeballs. In just two to two-and-a-half hours, the groups prepared, cooked, and shared these delicious recipes — all while building confidence in the kitchen.

Participants went home with recipe booklets and label-reading wallet cards, helping them keep up their healthy habits beyond the class. This program is all about increasing knowledge, skills, and confidence in choosing and preparing healthy foods — and we’re proud to say that this goal was well and truly achieved!
