11.1 QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO PROPOSED CARNABY'S COCKATOO STRUCTURE

In response to questions from community members, Cr Errington sought clarification of matters concerning the proposed Carnaby's Cockatoo installation.

i. Has the Shire formally committed to funding any aspect of the Carnaby's Cockatoo installation?

The President advised that the Shire has provided in principle support for the proposal and has not committed to fund any aspect of the project. The Shire has sought advice from the Kerkhof Carnaby Group (KCG) Incorporated as to the future costs and implications of maintaining the structure.

ii. What detailed costs for the installation have been provided to Council?

The ACEO advised that the Kerkhof Carnaby Group (KCG) Incorporated provided Council with initial cost estimates based on circa 2019/20 information. Council then requested detailed written construction costs plus whole-of-life insurance and maintenance costs. These have not yet been provided.

iii Has the site for the installation been officially approved?

The ACEO advised that Council had given in principle support for the project and acknowledged that Apex Park was a possible location for the installation. A final decision in respect of the final location of the installation is to be made by Council and the Kerkhof Carnaby Group (KCG) Incorporated.

iv If installed in Apex Park or on other public land, who will be responsible for the whole-of-life costs associated with the installation?

The ACEO advised that if the installation is constructed on any public land – including Apex Park, the Shire would carry the liability for the whole-of-life costs of the installation, unless another form of cost sharing or funding is secured and agreed by the parties.

v. What process has been undertaken to assess the extent of community support for the proposal?

The ACEO advised that the Shire has not undertaken any market surveys or testing to determine the extent of interest / support for the proposal. The Kerkhof Carnaby Group (KCG) Incorporated has cited what it believes to be the extent of support for the project and its potential benefits. Given the cost implications for the community, an independent process to determine the extent of support for the proposal and its location would be an appropriate step prior to final decisions being made by Council.
