9.2 **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES**

9.2.1 EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Fleetwood Australia Pty Ltd has further refined the design and quantities for the construction of the Early Childhood Development Centre. The company delivered its revised cost estimate for the project, which still contains some unquantified items. Matthews & Scavelli, architects have sought an explanation from Fleetwood Australia as to aspects of the reduced costs. The outstanding issue is the \$660K for provisional items in the budget, which the Shire has asked to be converted to firm costs.

The project budget is approaching a point that provides greater cost certainty – to the extent that this can be achieved in the current environment, and where the Shire would be able to commit to commencement of stage 1 of the project.

Key projects on which the Shire's equipment has proven to be essential include the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network, Roads to Recovery Programme and Shire repair and upgrade works typified by the work undertaken to repair recent flood damage.

10.1 BUSHFIRE RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN

Council is required to develop and agree a Bushfire Management Plan in conjunction with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services. This plan is central to the overarching State Hazard Fire Plan and subsidiary plans that govern firefighting efforts in Western Australia.

The Bushfire Risk Management Plan has been developed and reviewed extensively with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services to reflect the plan's intersection of the statutory framework governing responsibility for firefighting and the allocation of firefighting resources. The plan also has regard to the broad range of other policy and procedure documents issued by agencies directly or indirectly impacted by the State's firefighting policy. Its primary purpose is to establish the roles and responsibilities of officers across agencies to ensure the effective deployment of firefighting resources to protect lives and assets.

The Shire has worked extensively on this plan and supports its direction and intent.

It is recommended Council endorse the Bushfire Risk Management Plan and note that the Plan requires Council to provide Government with an annual report at the end of the financial year.
