Moora Hay Bales Concert a spectacular evening!

Perth Symphony Orchestra and the Shire of Moora, with funding from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, have been working together to bring Green Shoots Moora to our region over the past 9 months. The program saw PSO musicians guide local musicians and culminated in a spectacular concert on Saturday 29th March in a 'theatre' made of hay bales.





It was a spectacular evening, which showcased our local talent, a truly once in a lifetime experience for all participants, aged 8 to 82 years. The choirs of Moora Primary and St Joseph's Schools have been given a huge boost due to the magnificent Moora Hay Bales Concert.

"The performers were tremendous," said Tracy Lefroy, Shire President. "As a result of the event – and all the practice leading up to it – dozens of Moora children and adults have had the opportunity to embrace additional music learning and fun. Not only did the community experience the joy of the performances at the actual event, the Moora Hay Bales Concert activated a range of musical endeavors – from reigniting primary school choirs to inspiring other regional singers and musicians."

For many of the school children, performing on stage in front of a large audience was a life-changing and unforgettable experience.

"On behalf of Moora Shire, I would like to congratulate all involved, including the Perth Symphony Orchestra, the performers (young and old), and all those who travelled from Perth and the whole Wheatbelt region to join us for this magnificent event. 2025 Moora Triathlon

The 2025 Moora Triathlon, held on Sunday, March 16th, marked the third event since its return post-COVID, attracting 77 registrations and around 110 participants. The event saw a slight increase in participation compared to last year, with many local and Perthbased families returning to Moora for the weekend. One group of dedicated participants has been attending for over ten years, and this year, 13 members from the North West Tri Club joined after a single participant attended in 2024.

The event was praised by visitors, with many commenting on the friendly atmosphere and the excellent organization, making it a perfect experience for families. Local hero Jack Crago, fresh off his Osaka Marathon finish, triumphed in the Men's Open Sprint, with Milan Kucera taking second place.

Last year, Phil Manning cleared the old fence and the site. In February, Brian Cummings from BK Fencing installed the new fence, supplied by Bill Hobden from Central Midlands Steel. Moora Rotary Club and a farming sponsor paid for the fencing supplies.

The bike track has been laid thanks to James Porter, ready for line marking, and signs are on the way (both to be undertaken by the Shire of Moora). Greg Reilly has generously donated a 3x3m shed which will have bikes stored in it for use by the community.

Play equipment was picked up last week thanks to Emma Spong, Jesse Errington and Central Midlands Steel.

Moora Playgroup held a Busy Bee on Sunday 13th April from 8.30am – 11.30am at the Bowling Club to get the equipment installed, it was a wonderful turnout, and the equipment is all in place! Mulch will be delivered the week after Easter (to be spread – any helpers welcome).

Shire of Moora Community Budget Submissions

Each financial year, the Shire of Moora assists a range of community groups with projects, facility upkeep and events by offering a pool of up to \$80,000 of shared funding. Applications are now open for the 2025/2026 round of funding, and Council invites interested community groups to apply.

Applications are due by 4pm Friday 2 May 2025. Please visit the Shire website for an application form and guidelines, email mcd@moora.wa.gov.au or call 9651 0000. Hardcopy forms are available at the Shire admin office.

In 2024 – 2025, the Shire gave over \$70,000 to Community Budget Submission recipients. Funding and inkind services are provided and benefit so many.

Central Midlands Agricultural Society (the team behind the Moora Show) received over \$7,000 in in-kind support – including hire fee waiver, forklift hire, generator hire, and bin hire.

Central Midlands Senior High School received fee waivers for multiple events including their swimming carnival, and the school ball, as well as prizes (gym pass and pool passes) to use as fundraising prizes for the P&C to the value of \$4,700.

Hire fee waiver for the Miling Christmas Tree, for Miling Primary School for multiple events including their presentation night, swimming lessons and interschool activities, and for the P&C Quiz Night to \$1,300.



Over \$14,000 to the Moora Bed Race & Street Festival Organising Committee for hire of the rides, sound system, and in-kind traffic control/ road closures.

Just under \$11,000 to the Moora Historical Society for a new floor at the Moora Museum.

Over \$5,000 to the Moora Hospital Auxiliary for benches and a water feature in the new Moora Hospital Serenity Garden.



Over \$7,000 to the Moora Lions Club for a flash new generator for their food van and fee waivers for their Twilight Markets at the Moora Performing Arts Centre.



Moora Primary School received fee waivers for multiple events including the swimming pool, and the ovals, as well as prizes (gym pass and pool passes) to use as fundraising prizes for the P&C to the value of \$4,000.

Over \$6,000 to the Moora Triathlon Committee for public liability insurance and sundry expenses such as course marshals, timekeepers, shirts, medals etc, plus hire fee waiver of the pool and Apex Park, and in-kind traffic management.

\$2,000 to Moora Youth CARE Council for chaplaincy support for Moora Primary School & Central Midlands Senior High School.

\$2,000 to the NAIDOC Committee for hire fee waiver, speakers, catering and entertainment at their annual NAIDOC Event.

\$2,000 to the Rotary Club of Moora for the Australia Day Awards breakfast and vouchers (gym, pool pass, tip passes, hydro pool tickets, MPAC tickets) up to \$1,000 for their Auction night.



\$2,000 of hire fee waiver and in-kind support to Rural Health West for their Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program.

\$2,600 to the Watheroo Development Association for the purchase of a defibrillator for the Watheroo pavilion.

Central Midlands Hydrotherapy Pool

In our current busy life physical and mental health care is extremely important for everyone, and the Central Midlands Hydro Pool caters for both. The warm water is beneficial in soothing the body and mind, loosens tight muscles and encourages relaxation. Water-based exercise offers numerous benefits, including low-impact workouts that are gentle on joints, improve cardiovascular health, increase strength and endurance, and enhance flexibility and balance, all while promoting relaxation and stress reduction. Water based exercise can assist in reducing pain in joints and arthritis.

Over the last 12 months we have seen the growth in the usage of this facility and witnessed some amazing improvement in our patrons. With their consent, we would like to share some of their stories:

Rhys Howard

My journey with the Moora hydrotherapy pool has gone from needing to be supplied with an aquatic wheelchair to get in and out of the pool, and struggling to stand on the spot let alone walk, without stumbling in the deeper end, to being able to walk myself into the pool using the handrails down the ramp and walking many laps. have been attending the hydrotherapy pool, travelling from Wongan Hills since late May 2024. When I first attended for a therapy session due to a spinal cord injury that I obtained in January 2024.

I was very impressed with the facility. The pool has great egress as well as shower and toilet facilities that suited the wheelchair that I was using.

To everybody that got this facility up and running you have done an incredible job. I cannot thank the crew at the Moora Hydrotherapy pool enough, without their support and the facility, I would not be this far advanced in my recovery.

I recommend anyone with an injury or not, to get in the warm water and do come use the hydrotherapy pool.

Following back surgery in December, I have attended the pool 3-5 times a week for the past 8 weeks.

At the onset I used a walking frame with assistance to get into the pool when I arrived. The rails around the edges gave me security, now I'm able to walk unassisted in the pool without relying on the rails. We have watched the strength return to my body as I complete my exercises. I have enjoyed the friendly, helpful atmosphere and watching the progress others have made. My right foot is unresponsive, so I enjoy the freedom of walking in the pool without the fear of falling. We are blessed to have such great facilities in our town.

People are still asking me after two and half years, why have you moved from the coast to Moora. Well one of the main reasons was, I was able to use the Hydrotherapy pool. After starting out with 3 days a week going to the pool for 6 months when I could hardly walk, to 5 days a week and can now walk, and the aches in my body are sufferable to what they were. After my hours exercise, I can try and get through my day. I'm telling you if you ache, can't exercise, come to our pool it is wonderful for your body and your mind. It helps, and you meet some lovely people.



The facility offers early morning, seniors, parent/child and public sessions. (Refer to our timetable on the Shire website). Feel free to come down to the facility during our opening hours and speak to the friendly staff (Angela, Ken, Isla) who are there and ready to help you. No bookings required.



Moora Youth Centre

The program will utilize games to increase mobility, strength, and confidence, enabling seniors to engage in active recreation and social participation.

The first Moora Seniors Games took place on Friday 11th April at the Delmoor Centre. Beck Hefferon, physiotherapist, ran the morning by assisting with some exercises, breathing drills, and coordination skills before moving on to some low impact games like Ring Toss, Beanbag Toss and Pass Ball. It was great to see the encouragement from one another, working together to win the challenge and smile.

We are looking forward to the next session taking place on May 2nd, we hope to see you there!
