ANZAC DAY

On a crisp autumn morning, the Moora community gathered in large numbers to commemorate ANZAC Day at the newly refurbished Moora War Memorial. The moving service, organised by the Moora RSL, was a powerful reminder of the sacrifices made by those who have served - and continue to serve - our country.





With a fantastic turnout that reflected the deep respect held across the region, the ceremony paid tribute to the ANZAC spirit and the enduring legacy of courage, mateship, and sacrifice. Attendees stood shoulder to shoulder in solemn reflection, honouring the fallen and celebrating the freedoms we enjoy today because of their service.

Sean Brown delivered a heartfelt and honoured speech, reminding all present of the price paid by so many in major conflicts past, and recognising those who have served in peacekeeping missions on behalf of Australia since.

As the sun rose above the newly restored memorial, its gleaming facade stood as a symbol of remembrance and respect - an enduring site for future generations to reflect on the service and sacrifice of our defence personnel.

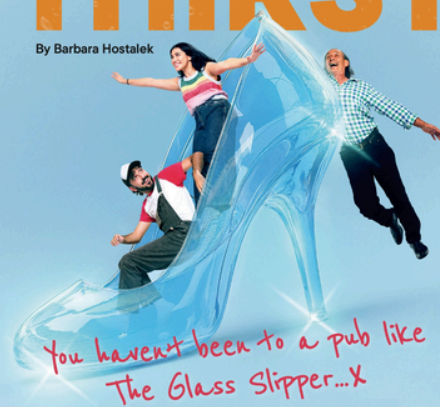
