

# MOORA MAGIC COTTAGE OPENS AS CORNERSTONE OF NEW EARLY CHILDHOOD PRECINCT

Families in Moora and surrounding regions will benefit from a major leap forward in early childhood care with the opening of the new Moora Magic Cottage Early Learning Centre, a \$3.7 million facility delivered as part of the Moora Shire's Early Childhood Development Precinct.

Located at 1 King Street, the purpose-built centre offers 55 permanent childcare places - almost doubling local capacity - and replaces the outdated Keane Street facility. The new childcare building, funded by the Shire of Moora and the Australian Government, will be operated by the privately owned Stegosaurus Pty Ltd, and will be known locally as Moora Magic Cottage.

While privately operated, the facility is a major component of the publicly funded precinct and is part of the Shire's long-term vision to support young families, promote early childhood health and drive economic growth in the region.



"This is the first time the Shire of Moora has substantially invested in early childhood services," said Shire President Tracy Lefroy. "By providing the facilities and the building to enable quality locally delivered services, we are creating genuine opportunities for local families, future workforce attraction and building the capacity of the Moora region."

The centre includes modern features such as individual infant sleep rooms, a dedicated art room, and a new outdoor playground. It caters to infants through to kindergarten-aged children and employs 12 staff, with more staff joining as the centre grows.

The Moora Early Childhood Development Precinct also includes the soon-to-open Wheatbelt Kids Institute, which will deliver critical child health services such as paediatrics, hearing and speech assessments, occupational therapy, and behavioural support. The proximity of these services offers added benefit to children enrolled at the Magic Cottage.

Shire of Moora CEO Gavin Robins said: "The establishment of the Moora Magic Cottage represents a strategically significant achievement for our Shire. It's the result of a forward-thinking collaboration between the Shire and Commonwealth Government, local and visiting service providers and our community. The facility addresses longstanding challenges in childcare access and positions Moora as a leader in regional early childhood development. We are immensely proud to see this vision realised."

An official opening event is planned for September 2025.



# THE 'MOORA BRIGHTER FUTURES PATHWAY' PROVIDES ACCESSIBLE ALLIED HEALTH SERVICES FOR CHILDREN IN THE COMMUNITY

# NOTICE OF INTENTION TO LEVY DIFFERENTIAL RATES 2025/26 FINANCIAL YEAR

In accordance with Section 6.36 of the Local Government Act 1995, the Shire of Moora proposes to adopt the following differential rates in the dollar and minimum payment amounts for the 2025/2026 Financial Year.

| Differential Rate Types | Proposed               |                  |

NOTE: The proposed rate in the dollar and minimum payment amounts may be varied by Council when adopting the annual budget.

Ratepayers and Electors are invited to make a submission to the Council in relation to this proposal. Submissions should be in writing, be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer and be clearly marked “Submission – Proposed Differential Rates 2025/2026”. Submissions must be received by the Shire no later than 4.00pm on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2025.

## Giving a voice to country youth

- Live or have previously lived rurally in WA Wheatbelt, SouthWest, and Great Southern (excluding within 30km of large regional areas such as Bunbury or Albany)
- Experienced country parties while living in the country i.e. you can reflect on earlier experience if you don't currently live in the country

- Participate in an in-depth 1 to 1.5 hour interview via virtual Teams meeting and by phone
- Contribute to a study with the potential to inform future policy and services for Australian youth
- All participant data will be grouped, and no one will be named or identified in the study results

Past studies conducted by the NDRI have incorporated youth perspective into the development of future programs. We cannot guarantee participants will receive any direct benefits from this study, but there is potential for future benefits to other young people. You will be reimbursed for your time.

The Shire of Moora is excited to welcome the Rebel Turtles Infant Aquatics Survival Program to the Central Midlands Hydrotherapy Pool this August!

Led by certified instructor Stacy from The Aquatics Academy, this program offers private, tailored survival swim lessons for infants through to school-aged children. The focus is on teaching vital water safety and survival skills that could one day save a life.

Program Highlights:

- 10-minute individual lessons, 3-4 times per week for 6+ weeks (24 sessions).
- Teaches life-saving "swim-float-swim" techniques.
- Builds muscle memory for effective results seen in weeks, not years.
- Parents receive critical education on drowning prevention.
- Classes are held locally in Moora, with future refresher lessons available.

Cost: \$950 per child + \$50 one-time family enrolment fee. A \$100 refundable deposit secures your spot if a waitlist applies. Payment plans are available.


